FLAME congregations are working together all summer on a special collection. Would you be willing to help? God's Work Our Hands Project!



Judy Miller passed away on Thursday, August 8, 2019. Her funeral service took place here at St. John's on Friday, August 23rd.



August 6, 2019

CALL TO ORDER: President Ann Voight called the meeting to order and asked Pastor Stacy to lead us in an opening prayer. Pastor Stacy shared the prayer that the Synod using this month. She encouraged us to ask ourselves where God is calling us this week.

MINUTES: Paula Hoffman moved and Ron Zorn seconded that we accept the June minutes as written. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Colleen Shupe presented the treasurer's report as of June 30, 2019:

Colleen reported that the ACH accounts will be switched from Civista Bank to Vacationland Credit Union by August 15th. Kevin Young moved and Bob Krawetzki seconded that we accept the report as presented. Motion passed with unanimous voice vote.

PASTOR STACY'S REPORT: Written report submitted. Pastor Stacy shared how she uses 10-15 hours a week in worship planning.

FAITH/LIFE TEAM: The next meeting of this team will be August 9th. They will be planning events for the next several months. On August 18th new members Marcia and Thomas Dawson, will be welcomed. A fellowship after the church service is being planned.

WORSHIP TEAM: Written report submitted. Barry went over some of the items listed in the written report. Rally Day with Bishop Daniel leading worship will be September 8th. Ann shared that the gift previously designated by Council to go to Bishop Daniel will be given to the Synod Discipleship Initiative. Bishop Daniel will be leading an open Sunday School class at 9 AM with coffee fellowship. A pot luck will be held following the church service.

FINANCE TEAM: Ron Zorn shared that the online giving process is proceeding well thanks to Pastor Vance's hard work. Council will be updated as this progresses. As of September 1st St. John's will be using the county aggregate electrical supplier, AEP. Ron has been working with the Property Team to find some solutions for better usage of our heat pumps.

PROPERTY TEAM: Jeff reported that the Property Team

- consulted with Hartland Plumbing and Heating to retrofit the heat pumps so that they can be programmed from the phone. Hartland is also working on a new upgraded system for setting the boilers to come on and off.
- Rex Rickly is working with Ron Laws and Bill Lucht to install in the fellowship hall a newly donated 55" flat screen smart TV that Ron Laws and Paula Hoffman are donating to St. John's.
- The garden is going well and is producing cabbage and beans so far.

SCHOLARSHIP TEAM: Kim Luman has joined the team. Two scholarships have been awarded for this year: Kyle Young and Kassidy Burdue.

FLAME: The Corn Boil will be held on August 19th at Zion in Huron at 5:30 PM.. The FLAME minutes are always posted in our monthly newsletter. Anyone having ideas for FLAME projects for this coming year is asked to talk with Bob or Jerrie Krawetzki.

ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE: All requests for endowment grants are to be in by October 15th. Council will be asking for \$1500 to be used for contingencies. Any other ideas for grants are to be given to Ann Voight before the October Council meeting.

SAFETY TEAM: The team has developed a five-page grid from which the Plan will be completed. The established grid identifies risk type, definition of that risk, a ranking of likelihood that the risk will happen and severity if that risk happens and finally the action that should take place. The team will report to Council for input/feedback.

OLD BUSINESS

COUNCIL PRAYER REQUEST FOR SEPTEMBER: The request is three-fold: We pray that students, teachers, families and staff will have a good school year. We pray the Northwestern Ohio Synod, Bishop Daniel Beaudoin, Staff and ELCA Presiding Bishop Eaton have a good year. We pray that the volatile conditions in our country can be brought to an end.

NEW BUSINESS

Our youth representative, Jenna Stacy, will be staying in the area with her present employment and will continue to be a member of St. John's Council. Congratulations, Jenna, on the job upgrade and we are glad you will be continuing to serve St. John's!

SPURS: Kevin Young announced that the next SPURS meeting will be held on Monday evening, October 27th, at 6 PM in the fellowship room.

Constitution, Bylaws and Resolutions will be reviewed by Kevin Young, Peg Kingsley, Ann Voight, Barry Laird and Bob Krawetzki. Ann has been in contact with Jacob Henry at NWOS and has reviewed the process with him.
