





#### Take Your Kids to Church!

Take your kids to church.

Make the effort. Wake them up early. Fool with the belts and the buckles and the fancy hair bows. Endure the sleepy, grumpy faces and the misplaced shoes. Run around like a mad woman gathering everybody's everything and trying to get out the door on time. Hop to the car with a shoe in each hand. Give those babies a poptart and some milk and let 'em eat it in the car. If its raining, get wet. If its cold, get a jacket. If you're tired, go tired. But take those babies to church. You know why?

Because Jesus is there.

He's there. And He'll meet them there. And you too, Mama.

He'll be there in the sweet smile of their Sunday School teacher as she greets them into their room. He'll be there in the goldfish and the apple juice and the filling of their little bellies and hearts. He'll be there in the hug from a sweet friend and the encouraging smile that assures you that they "just barely made it" too. He'll be there in the sacred words read from the Bible speaking truth to their little impressionable hearts. He'll be there in the worship and the raised hands and the watery eyes and whispers of praise.

So take them. Carry all of their Bibles and drawings and toilet paper tube creations. Sit by them in worship. Open your Bible and open theirs. Show them how to find the scripture the pastor is preaching from. Show them how to worship. Explain to them why He's worthy of worship. Let them see you laugh and cry and praise and study. Forgive their wiggles and paper rustles and know that they're listening even when it seems like they aren't. Ask them questions and answer the ones they ask you. Introduce them to Jesus. Tell them of His greatness - his power - his faithfulness. Tell them with your words and show them with your life. Tell them what he's done for you and how you've been changed by His grace and forgiveness and goodness and love. Tell them how they can be too. Point them to Jesus. Over and over again.

Take your kids to church. They'll love it there. It's the only place where they can go and just be themselves. They don't have to "be" good enough or smart enough or athletic enough. They don't have to perform for approval or achievement. They just get to go and hear how much God loves them. Just because they're them. Just because He created them, they're valued. Wanted. Their worth isn't based on the grades they make or their ability to throw a curveball. Its not dependent on their performance or skill level. And they need a little more of that, don't you think? A little more grace and a little less pressure. A little more love and a few less demands.

Take them to church. Before you take them to the ballfield or the gym. Before you take them on vacation or to grandma's or to the backyard to play. Take them to church. Let them know its a priority. Show them it has eternal value. Let them see you set aside schedules and extra curricular activities and work and busy-ness to be present with the Lord in His house. I promise you won't regret it. I promise you it won't return back void.

Take them to church.

**CALL TO ORDER**: President Ann Voight called the meeting to order and asked Pastor Stacy to lead us in an opening prayer. Pastor Stacy shared the scripture that the Synod is using this month, taken from Ezekiel 37 which talks about every day God breathes life into us, in everything we do. As Council members we remember that God is breathing life into us as we do the work of the Church.

**MINUTES**: Ron Zorn moved and Barry Laird seconded that we accept the August minutes as written. Motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

**PASTOR STACY'S REPORT:** Written report submitted. Pastor Stacy is working on plans for the Catechism Class and is enjoying the work. She reported that she went to the county fair to see the projects our St. John's youth exhibited. Ann Voight expressed Council's appreciation for Pastor Stacy's detailed planning of her schedule for the remainder of the year.

**FAITH/LIFE TEAM**: Written report submitted. Paula Hoffman shared that the team is working on a community stewardship project with Zion Lutheran in Huron. More information is forthcoming.

**WORSHIP TEAM**: Barry Laird reported that he is working on a worksheet which will provide step by step instructions of how to work the TV now installed in the basement. Bishop Daniel will be speaking on Rally Day about this being a year of focus on scripture.

**FINANCE TEAM**: Ron Zorn shared that the online giving is now available on our website and instructions for using it will be available in church. By the end of this month all St. John's monies should be transferred from Civista to Vacationland Credit Union.

**PROPERTY TEAM:** Jeff reported:

- Hartland has proposed two ways to fix the broken heat pump. Replacement of the pump would cost about \$4400 or repairing the existing one would be about \$1300. Before making a decision Council is asking the Property Team to consult with Mitsubishi to see if they can determine the cause of the pump's failure.
- consulted with Hartland Plumbing and Heating to retrofit the heat pumps so that they can be programmed from the phone. Hartland is also working on a new upgraded system for setting the boilers to come on and off.
- The garden is coming to its end. Corn will be picked one more time next week and tomatoes and cabbages are almost gone. Pumpkins will soon be ready for the kids to pick and decorate.

Many thanks were expressed to Jeff, Ron Zorn and the others who have worked so hard this summer to grow and distribute all the vegetables grown in the Giving Garden.

**FLAMe:** Bob Krawetzki reported the Corn Boil was a success with 59 people attending. At some future time a talk about the burn pits will be offered after church in the basement.

# ENDOWMENT GRANTS: All endowment grant applications are to be submitted by Oct. 15<sup>th</sup>. Ann Voight shared four grant proposals for which Council is applying:

- 1. \$1000 Trinity Seminary, Capital University
- 2. \$1000 Bishop Daniel's Discipleship initiative—September, 2020
- 3. \$1200 support of seminarians-calendar year 2020
- 4. \$1500 for Contingency items which may carry over each year until all is used

Our youth representative, Jenna Stacy, will be staying in the area with her present employment and will continue to be a member of St. John's Council. Congratulations, Jenna, on the job upgrade and we are glad you will be continuing to serve St. John's!

Ann thanked all the helpers who stayed after the August Council meeting to count the "jug money" from Lenten suppers and various cash donations. With a final donation of \$26.69 the total came to \$500. This money will be donated to the building of Tanzania Water Wells.

Ann spoke with Jacob Henry who will email her the 2019 NWOS Constitution. The changes made in 2019 will be incorporated into St. John's Constitution when the committee begins work to revise our Constitution.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

SEMINARIAN DAN GUTMAN, our first sponsored seminarian was ordained on August 31, at Sidney, OH. He was installed on September 3<sup>rd</sup> at Zion in Lima, OH. We sent him a card and gift: \$25 to Applebees in Lima.

BISHOP DANIELS' FALL CONFERENCE in October will be held at four different churches: Oct. 10<sup>th</sup> at Whitehouse, Oct. 15<sup>th</sup> at Bucyrus, Oct. 22<sup>nd</sup> at Fremont and Oct. 29<sup>th</sup> at Zion Lima (Dan Gutman is now the minister there). STEWARDSHIP AD HOC COMMITTEE: Pastor Stacy shared that she would like to form an ad hoc committee to create a stewardship booklet showing how and where St. John's is committed to stewardship. # Firelands Lutherans Active in Mission Working to make Christ known in the community by building connective programs and cooperative ministries among us

Your FLAMe Board hosted a corn potluck in August at Zion, Huron for the entire FLAMe community. The potluck was to recognize the Giving Garden Crew and to enjoy the fruits of their labor and the great harvest. The Giving Garden allowed FLAMe to share all summer long the home-grown, healthy food with area families in need through food banks, senior centers, and area organizations that work to feed the poor. The Board received a thank-you card from the Erie County Senior Center with several signatures and short notes from individuals saying how much they enjoyed the Garden's sweetcorn.

The FLAMe congregations continue to seek your congregation's support for **Burn Pit 360**. During the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, the government contractors burned tons of hazardous waste in open pits using jet fuel. Items burned included lithium batteries, medical waste, ammunition, chemicals, and more. The result is our exposed soldiers have been poisoned and are dying of lung illnesses and cancers that are baffling researchers and doctors. The soldiers are not able to get benefits to pay for these illnesses. Susan Zeier, the Ohio advocate for Burn Pits 360 is willing to speak to your congregation. Congress has finally agreed to a hearing on the topic, but at this time is refusing to allow the Veterans who are affected to speak and express their needs and concerns. Susan will provide letters and post cards asking Congress to hear from the Veterans.

Next month we hope to have numbers to share with you to see how well FLAMe did in collecting items and money for our local agencies that are involved with foster care. Pastor Katie Suggitt will meet on September 29<sup>th</sup> with representatives to pack and prepare the items for delivery.

The Board's September meeting was spent reviewing and previewing project proposals.
